## Boys Uniform



- Shorts/ pants- Grey deluxe college baggies with a black beltShirt- Short and long sleeve with
- Shirt- Short and long sleeve with school logo.



## Boys uniform - Shoes & Socks



- Plain, all black lace-up with all shiny leather uppers (not suede) covering the whole foot.
- Grey socks with green & white stripes



### Girls Uniform



- Skirt- Green and blue tartan pleated style. Shorts/ long pants- Plain bottle green Shirt- Short and long sleeve with school logo.





#### Girls Uniform- Shoes & Socks



Plain, all black lace-up with all shiny leather uppers (not suede) covering the whole foot. No high tops or 'Shirley Temple' shoes.

White with one green stripe. Short style but still covers the

ankles.



 An all white (no writing or colouring) long sleeve top can be worn under school shirts during cooler weather.

















## Jumper & Jackets



Non- school jumpers/hoodies are not allowed. Students will be asked to remove them and they will be confiscated for the day. A school jacket will be provided to them for that day.

On extra cool days wearing both jumper and jacket is acceptable.

Appropriate wet-weather jackets in wet conditions are encouraged to and from school.









#### Winter accessories



Any non- school scarfs and mittens/ gloves are allowed.



## Summer Sports Uniform



- Bottle green taslon material with blue and white stripes on the side and elastic waist.
- Shirt Green, blue and white polo shirt with collar and embroidered school crest.



## Winter Sports Uniform




- Tracksuit: Taslon top and pants in school colours with school crest on the top.



#### Hats & Beanies

- Only Blue school cap/ beanie with 3D CHS motif allowed (available for purchase at school office).
- Years 7 & 8 must wear hats for PE & sport classes, and hats are optional for the other year groups.



## When to wear Sports Uniform

- Only to be worn on a Thursday or for whole day school sporting activities.
- For PDHPE activities, however, must change back into regular school uniform.
- If students wear their sports uniform out of sport/PE Prac time they are considered out of uniform.
- Year 7 and 8 students must wear their school hat on sports days- if they do not have a hat, they are considered out of uniform.

## Sport - Shoes & Socks

- Shoes: Fully covered leather or synthetic uppers. Must be cross training or running style with wedge type shock absorption midsole.
- No flat Vans/Volleys/Converse/airforce
- <u>Socks:</u> Any suitable white sports socks or school socks that are visible when worn and cover the ankle. No logos on socks.























#### Additional

- Bags: Large enough backpacks only
- <u>Jewellery:</u> Modest and simple. Students with overly embellished/long jewellery will be asked to take it off.
- <u>Piercings:</u> Only studs allowed, this includes nose piercings. Facial piercings are strongly discouraged.
- Make-Up: Minimal
- Nails: Overly long/ fake nails are not permitted automatic after school detention
- <u>Hair colour/style:</u> natural
- Any embellishments that do not comply with OHS expectations must be taken off. This is up to the discretion of the school.
- A 'blue slip' will be issued for the above infringements.





















## Procedure if out of uniform- 'Blue slips'

A 'blue slip' is proof that the student has followed proper school procedure.

- Students are to see the uniform teacher before school or at assembly to receive their 'blue slip'.
- Even with a note from a parent, students are to get a 'blue slip'.
- If a student is late to school they must see the uniform teacher at recess/lunch.
- The 'blue slip' must be produced whenever a staff member asks to see it. If students cannot produce their 'blue slip', it will be an automatic after school detention.

#### Procedure if out of uniform- Parent notes

- A letter from a parent with an explanation, date, name of child, roll call class and your signature must be provided if the student is out of uniform. The note will only be valid with a signature from the parent.
- A medical certificate is to be supplied if students are out of uniform due to medical reasons.
- If a student is consistently out of uniform and provides a note from a parent every time, that parental note may no longer apply.

#### Procedure if out of uniform- After school detentions

- Uniform infringements accumulate with each item that is out of uniform without a parental note on the student, not for the day they are out of uniform.
- For example, if on a certain day a student has three items out of uniform without a parental note that will lead to an after school detention.
- Students who are out of uniform three times <u>in a school year</u> without a parent note will be issued with an after school detention. <u>This does not reset each term.</u>
- After school detention letters are issued to students during roll call, and a letter will also be sent home to parents/guardians. Students are given a 1-2 weeks notice for an afternoon detention
- If a student is unable to attend an after school detention they must arrange an alternate date with their <u>Deputy</u>.

#### Automatic After School Detentions

Students will be issued with an automatic afternoon detention for:

- Nails
- For not showings blue slip when out of uniform
- For refusing to get a blue slip

In Semester 2 in 2023, upon principal decision, students who did not have correct shoes and did not provide a note on Sport days, were issued with automatic afternoon detentions. This may come into place in 2024.
