

Cronulla High School Thredbo 2025 Skiing / Snowboarding Excursion

Dear Parents and Carers,

Cronulla High School offers students in Year 10 with a current record of good behaviour the opportunity to either learn how to ski/snowboard or improve on their current skill level at our annual snow trip in July/August. This excursion also provides students with an excellent opportunity to enjoy the company of their peers and teachers in one of our most picturesque National Parks. Students who attend will ski/snowboard for three days and receive expert tuition from the Thredbo Snow Sports School Instructors each day.

Students will depart from Cronulla Railway Station by coach on Tuesday 29 July at approximately 11:30pm, arriving at the Snowy Valley Resort at 6.00am on Wednesday for breakfast. Students will enjoy three days of skiing or snowboarding, staying overnight at the Snowy Valley Resort on Wednesday and Thursday nights. Students will return to Cronulla Railway Station on Friday 1 August at approximately 11:30pm.

To be eligible to attend each student must:

- Have had no suspensions or more than ONE afternoon detentions <u>this year</u>. (Detention types included in this count are general behaviour, mobile phone and sport detentions.)
- Settle Statement of Account before your final balance is due. Any parent undergoing financial difficulty, please call the Principal who will confidentially discuss alternative arrangements.
- Attend all sports carnivals or provide notes from parents/caregivers explaining any absences.
- Clear all N-Warning tasks from this year prior to attending the snow trip.

The cost per student will be from \$1165. This price includes:

- Luxury coach transport equipped with video and toilet;
- 2 nights of accommodation at the Snowy Valley Resort;
- 3 breakfasts, 2 dinners at Snowy Valley Resort and 3 hot lunches at Thredbo;
- National Park entrance fees;
- Professional tour guide;
- A 3-day unrestricted lift pass at Thredbo (Australia's longest runs);
- 3 days Ski or Snowboard morning lessons for all levels (2 hours duration);
- 3 days ski, boots and stocks hire (snowboard hire incurs an additional cost);
- 3 days helmet and clothing hire (parka and waterproof pants).

Additional costs (if required):

- All first timer and beginner snowboarders and skiers must complete a compulsory extra lesson on Wednesday afternoon. Cost is \$35.
- 3 days Snowboard hire \$45 (includes board, soft boots and wrist guards).
- Please note that the excursion cost of \$1165 also does not include: sunglasses, goggles, gloves, beanie, scarf, and other clothing items.

Travel insurance

The purchase of travel insurance is highly recommended. You can arrange travel insurance through companies like NRMA, GIO or any provider of your choice. Travel insurance covers your child while on the excursion and covers the cost if you need to cancel or can no longer attend for unforeseen reasons prior to the event. If you remain uninsured, then it is at your own risk.

Places on the excursion

Students wishing to attend the snow excursion are required to pay a \$200 deposit. If there are more than 70 students, there will be two or more coaches. If not, then the maximum number of students that can fit in one larger coach is 54, so <u>only the first 54 students paying a \$200 deposit and returning the signed note will be assured of a place</u>. If more students pay than we can accommodate, we will create a waiting list based on when the \$200 deposit was paid.

In accordance with Department of Education guidelines, helmets are compulsory for all skiers and snowboarders and all snowboarders must wear wrist guards as well as helmets. Hire of helmets is included in the excursion cost. Wrist guards are included in the additional snowboard hire cost or can also be bought, hired or borrowed from elsewhere but all equipment brought must be in good working order.

The excursion includes 3 days on the snow and provides a great opportunity for students to develop an appreciation for our Snowy Mountains in the company of many of their friends. If you are interested, make sure your son/daughter <u>pays the \$200 deposit and returns the signed note by Monday 17 March.</u>

The balance (\$965 + any extras) will be **due at the end of Term 2, Week 3, (Friday 16/5/2025)**. If there is a major delay in your final payment, then your place may be offered to another student on the waiting list. Cancellation conditions do apply for this excursion.

As well as paying your \$200 deposit, please complete the forms attached and return them to Mr Franks in the Mathematics staffroom. This is the information that the company needs to collect to ensure the best fit for skis, boards and other equipment. We also need a parent or guardian to sign the note to show that you have read and understood the cancellation conditions.

During Term 2 a more detailed permission note will be sent home to complete and return as well as a full itinerary for the duration of this excursion.
