

## Year 10 Recognition Evening 2024

The Year 10 Recognition Evening is a voluntarily event put on by staff as part of our school goals of recognising achievement. It is strictly a criterion-based rewards event. Since its inception in 2011, criteria are applied to ensure a successful and safe evening. Students who do not fulfil all the criteria will not unless there are significant extenuating circumstances (Principal's discretion) be invited to attend.

These criteria include behaviour, academic and attendance aspects. Students will not be invited if they have in 2024:

- Failed to achieve the qualification for a NESA Record of School Achievement (RoSA). This means that they have received at least an E grade in ALL core courses and have not been N determined.
- Any N Determination Warning letters which have not been redeemed
- Achieved an overall attendance percentage of less than 85%
- Have incomplete after school detentions.
- Have unpaid contributions other than the voluntary school contribution and P & C contributions (subject to Principal discretion following prior communication from home on the matter)
- Been suspended more than once.
- Been suspended once and have accrued more than 5 after school detentions.
- Have accrued more than 10 after school detentions.
- Failed to participate in Mock Interviews

## Students will be expected to attend school on the day of the Recognition Evening until midday, without exception.

These criteria started in 2011 and have been consistently and rigidly applied since. The criteria are regularly spelt out on many occasions to students throughout the year **and are not negotiable**. We will undertake to work with all students to attempt to ensure every student meets our expectations. However, for students who through their own actions become ineligible to attend, we will formally advise them as the invitation list is finalised.
