Applications are open

Applications for study in semester 2, 2022 and 2023 are now open. You can apply for undergraduate study as well as the Schools Recommendation Scheme, Educational Access Scheme and Equity Scholarships. Courses will be added in the coming months and all semester 1, 2023 courses will be available from early August.

Educational Access Scheme

Institutions acknowledge that difficult circumstances can prevent students from reaching their true academic potential, particularly if their educational performance has been affected by long-term disadvantage. The <u>Educational Access Scheme (EAS)</u> can help.

Schools Recommendation Scheme

The <u>Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS)</u> is one way institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission to Year 12 students. They do this by using criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR. You must apply through UAC for undergraduate admission in 2022–23 to be eligible for SRS.

Equity Scholarships

<u>Equity Scholarships</u> help financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with tertiary study. Details of requirements for individual scholarships can be found on the <u>institution websites</u>.

How to apply through UAC

Special entry requirements

Entry into certain undergraduate degrees such as medicine, dentistry, health science and law is highly competitive and the selection process is rigorous. Certain courses require applicants to sit an admissions test for entry.

Check the course descriptions on the undergraduate course search to find out if the course you're interested in has any special entry requirements.

Medicine and medical sciences

You may be required to sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT). <u>Find out more about</u> <u>UCAT</u>.

Law

For students interested in studying law at UNSW in 2023, you will need to sit the Law Admission Test (LAT 2022). <u>Visit UNSW's website</u> for further information.

CQUniversity's Principal's Recommendation Scheme Alternate Entry Pathway

Applications for Term 1, 2023 are now open and will close 1 December 2022

Tax File Number

Any student will need a tax file number if he/she starts work (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start. Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they will be requested to provide their Tax File Number (TFN) on enrolment to TAFE or university next year, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early! Students must now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a <u>participating</u> <u>Australia Post office.</u>
