Apply for undergraduate study

Applying is quick and easy.

Take a look at our short video guides for Year 12 students and post-school applicants.

You can apply or log in between 7.30am and midnight and we'll automatically log you out if you're inactive for 30 minutes.

There is a non-refundable processing charge of \$73.00. You can pay using Mastercard, Visa or PayPal. Your application is not complete until you have paid.

Do not submit more than one application in each admissions year. Duplicate applications will be cancelled. Log back in to your application to update your contact details, qualifications or course preferences.

Offers are made on specific dates throughout the year. There are application deadlines for each offer round.

What is the ATAR?

The ATAR is a rank, not a mark.

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 0.00 and 99.95 that indicates a student's position relative to all the students in their age group (ie all 16 to 20 year olds in NSW). So, an ATAR of 80.00 means that you are 20 per cent from the top of your age group (not your Year 12 group).

Universities use the ATAR to help them select students for their courses and admission to most tertiary courses is based on your selection rank (your ATAR + any applicable adjustments). Most universities also use other criteria when selecting students (eg a personal statement, a questionnaire, a portfolio of work, an audition, an interview or a test).

UOW Applications and Auditions

Applications to the Bachelor of Performance and Theatre are assessed based on academic results and audition.

Before you organise your audition you must first have applied for admission.

The outcome of your audition will be communicated in response to your application for admission.

After you have applied for admission, organise your audition.

Auditions for Early Admission must be submitted as a Digital Audition.

Auditions for UAC, Direct Entry or Course Transfer can be done EITHER in person on campus in Wollongong, OR as a Digital Audition. You can decide which method best suits you. Follow the side links to register for your audition, and remember to select a method and date that matches your admission pathway!
